Policy context: EU Green Deal


- A growth strategy, long term vision, green recovery
- Nature and climate are essential parts of the equation







Policy context: EU Biodiversity Strategy







Policy context, more concretely:

- "EU Nature Restoration Law" under negotiation
- Biogeographical process: assessment of national pledges for (strictly) Protected Areas (additional to Natura 2000 sites)
- "30% improvement target" of the Biodiversity Strategy: no deterioration in conservation trends and status of all protected habitats and species by 2030 + 30% of species and habitats which are not in good status to show a positive trend by 2030
- Need to work on protected areas and beyond
- More co-ordinated efforts, more partnerships (with NGOs, authorities, etc.) to integrate nature in all sectors Higher contribution from land users (landowners, farmers, foresters, hunters, etc.)
- More resources: LIFE, LIFE Strategic Nature Action Projects, CAP, Resilience and Recovery Funds, EU Regional Development Funds

Private Land Conservation

- PLC = a <u>complementary</u> approach to nature conservation
- On-going reflection at EU level on how to mobilize private landowners and users for more voluntary action for nature on their land
- In this context, "private landowners" = landowners whose main objectives are traditionally <u>not</u> nature conservation ("individual" private landowners, companies, religious organisations, etc.).
- Focus on private land although some tools can also apply to public land.





Foster voluntary contribution to nature: Why?

- Different objectives but there are common grounds: farmers, authorities, NGOs => Need to find the right match to mobilize people on a voluntary basis
- Voluntary contribution for nature = a rather new approach that can:
 - Deliver more biodiversity and action for the climate
 - Enlarge the number of people acting for nature and the surface of high-nature value areas
 - Deliver more thanks to partnerships (NGO-landowner, landowner-authority, etc.)
 - Be low cost (sometimes) and trigger more money in nature (also from the landowners)
 - Deliver, at the same time, different levels & types of ecosystem services, depending on the contribution (long-term/short term, location, etc.)
 - Support new business opportunities.





Higher voluntary contribution in nature: Where?


Protected areas (including some Natura 2000 sites)

Land protected for other reasons than biodiversity (but important for biodiversity, e.g. protection of watersheds)

Wider countryside (non-protected areas)













Different ecological, economic, and social conditions \rightarrow diversity of methods to engage farmers •





Foster voluntary contribution to nature: How?

- Highest added value when long-term commitments
- Different legal/administrative tools can be envisaged (a.o. land stewardship agreements)
- Need to adapt the tool to the national/regional context: Test new partnerships at local leve, such as the two « Pacts for Biodiversity ».
- Share experience.





Higher voluntary contribution in nature: a role for each – build trust!

Landowners:

- Explore new perspectives
- Keep moving towards more biodiversity-friendly practices

Companies and organizations:

- Explore new perspectives
- Support
- Organize
- Finance

National/regional authorities:

- Create the necessary legal/fiscal framework for more voluntary action (beyond legal obligations)
- Promote
- Fund: LIFE projects, LIFE SNAPs, CAP, RRF, ERDF



NGOs:

- Explore new perspectives
- Create partnerships
- Adapt the offer

EU Commission:

- Support: LIFE EU Networks for Private Land Conservation – EU Conservation Landowners Coalition
- Fund: LIFE, Interreg, etc.
- Promote

Citizens:


- Participate

What is the EU LIFE Programme

- Created in 1992 LIFE is the key European fund for nature conservation
- Today LIFE programme as a whole constitutes a 100% contribution to the objectives and targets of the European Green Deal.
- The only EU programme dedicated exclusively to the environment, nature conservation and climate action.
- For the years 2021-2027, a budget of 5.43 billion €.

Opportunities with LIFE

- LIFE project « European Network for Private Land Conservation » (<u>https://enplc.eu/</u>) : till 2024.
 Developping an EU support for Private Land Conservation => important to liaise with them.
- Other past, on-going, and future « traditional » LIFE nature projects with long-term commitments for nature: source of inspiration, sum of experience, networking, etc.
- Technical Assistance for Replication (TA-R) projects: additional replication/ transfer efforts and objectives + issues emerging during the predecessor project and could not be addressed before. Expand the "Pact for Biodiversity" beyond where it has been tested?


